Interesting Facts

- Testament means "covenant" or "contract".
- The Bible was written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit by over 40 different authors from all walks of life: shepherds, farmers, tent-makers, physicians, fishermen, priests, philosophers and kings. Despite these differences in occupation and the span of years it took to write it, the Bible is an extremely cohesive and unified book.
- Moses was the single author that contributed the most books to the Old Testament. He wrote the first five books of the Bible, referred to as the Pentateuch; the foundation of the Bible. (also known as the *Hebrew Scriptures*)
- Paul was the single author that contributed the most books to the New Testament. He wrote 14 books (over half) called the 14 Pauline Epistles.
- The Bible was written over a period of some 1,500 years, from around 1450 B.C. (the time of Moses) to about 100 A.D. (following the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ).
- Many scholars agree that Job is the oldest book in the Bible, written by an unknown Israelite about 1500 B.C. Others hold that the Pentateuch (the first five books of the Bible) is the oldest books in the Bible, written between 1446 and 1406 B.C.
- The Bible was written in three languages: Hebrew, Aramaic, and Koine Greek.
- The entire New Testament as we know it today was canonized before the year 375 A.D. The Old Testament had previously been canonized long before the advent of Christ.

Did You Know

- The Bible was printed in 1454 A.D. by Johannes Gutenberg who invented the "type mold" for the printing press. It was the first book ever printed.
- The Book of Psalm is the longest book in the Bible.
- 2 John is the shortest book in the Bible.
- Psalm 119 is the longest chapter in the Bible.
- Psalm 117 is the shortest chapter in the Bible.
- Esther 8:9 is the longest verse in the Bible.
- John 11:35 is the shortest verse in the Bible.
- The Book of Esther is the only book in the Bible that doesn't mention the word God.
- Methuselah was the oldest man that ever lived. 969 years (Gen. 5:27)
- Moses was the meekest man that ever lived. (Num. 12:3)
- Enoch & Elijah were the only two men in the Bible that never saw death.
- The Bible has been translated into 2,018 languages.
- The Bible is the all-time best selling book in the world.
